Manufacturing SETA (MerSETA) Closing the Automotive Industry Skills Gap

For immediate release.

A group of 251 learners have graduated in the Eastern Cape, proving that the partnership between Volkswagen South Africa (VWSA) and the Manufacturing, Engineering and related services Sector Education and Training Authority (Merseta) is playing off –especially in the field of artisan training. Volkswagen SA is an accredited Merseta training provider, and its multipurpose centre not only trains VWSA learners, but also trains learners from other institutions such as the Automotive Industry Development Centre (AIDC), the Coega project, Continental and General Motors. Merseta has put the system and framework in place, while VWSA has provided the platform and resource. With the shortage of technical skills a national concern, it is hoped the new graduates will make a difference in their workplaces. A total of 17 artisans received Automobile Manufacturing Industry (AMIC) certificates; ABET (adult basic education) produced a total of 70 graduates at different levels , and 53 group leaders received their NQF level 5 certificates. Speaking at the graduates ceremony, Merseta CEO Dr Raymond Patel quoted Anthony Robbins on success "Success is not an accident; it is not some random roll of the dice," he said. "There are consistent, logical patterns of action, specific pathways to excellence that are within reach of us all; we simply must learn how to turn on and use our minds and bodies in the most powerful and advantageous ways by triggering these seven basic success mechanisms". Patel urged young people to take their personal training and development seriously so that they can contribute to the mainstream economy. Many learners, especially those who had not previously had a chance to further their education, struggled to hold back tears of joy as they ascended the podium to receive certificate. Mzimkulu Wellman Vazi and Mzwandile Richard Nelani, who graduated on ABET level 5, couldn't conceal their jubilation. Having started at VWSA in 1987 as a forklift driver, Nelani graduated as a paint shop operator." I feel great for having come this far "he said.
