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1. DEFINITIONS

For the purposes of this document the following word/terms will have this meaning unless the context indicates otherwise, any word or expression to which meaning has been assigned in this document must bear the meaning so assigned.

- 1.1. **"B-BBEE"**- Means broad- based black economic empowerment, as defined in Section 1 of the Broad- Based Empowerment Act.
- 1.2. **"B-BBEE status level of contributor"** means the B-BBEE status of an entity in terms of a code of good practice on black economic empowerment issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 1.3. **"Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act"** means the **Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);**
- 1.4. **"National Treasury"** has the meaning assigned to it in section 1 of the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act No. 1 of 1999);
- 1.5. **"Price"** includes all applicable taxes less all unconditional discounts
- 1.6. **"Proof of B-BBEE status level of contributor"** means-
- The B-BBEE status level certificate issued by an authorised body or person;
 - A sworn affidavit as prescribed by the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice; or
 - Any other requirement prescribed in terms of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 1.7. **"SBD"** means Standard Binding Document
- 1.8. **"Skills Development Act"** means the Skills Development Act, (Act No. 97 of 1998);
- 1.9. **"The Act"** means the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000);
- 1.10. **"Treasury"** has the meaning assigned to it in section 1 of the Public Finance Management Act, 1999 (Act No. 1 of 1999).
- 1.11. **"IP"** means Intellectual Property as envisioned in the Intellectual Property Laws Amendment Act, 2013 (Act No. 28 of 2013)
- 1.12. **"Intellectual Property"** deals with the rules for securing and enforcing legal rights to inventions, designs, artistic works and technological developments relating to intangible property.

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2. BACKGROUND

The merSETA is the Manufacturing, Engineering and Related Services Education and Training Authority established to promote the Skills Development Act, (Act No. 97 of 1998). It facilitates skills development in the following sub-sectors: metal and engineering, automotive manufacturing, motor retail and component manufacturing, new tyre manufacturing and plastics industries.

3. INTRODUCTION

The merSETA is a state owned entity with its Head office in Melville Johannesburg. The merSETA as well as its Regional offices seek to appoint a panel of Attorneys to effectively and efficiently provide assistance to the merSETA in respect of its legal affairs. The Panel will merSETA with matters that include but are not limited to intellectual property, risk assessment and mitigation as well as litigation.

4. OBJECTIVE

The objective of this project is to procure services of a Panel of ten (10) Attorney's to assist the merSETA with legal matters on as and when needed basis.

5. PROJECT/ CONTRACT PERIOD

The contract period for this project will be from 01 April 2020 to 31 March 2025

6. SCOPE OF PROJECT

6.1. To provide a broad spectrum of legal services to the merSETA on a monthly basis, as well as adhoc assignments on an as and when needed basis. The successful firms will be required to render legal services to the merSETA in the following areas:

6.1.1. Provision of regulatory support and legal advice relating to either or collectively with regard to special emphasis on Skills Development, the Public Finance Management Act the Public Preferential Procurement Framework Act, the Treasury Regulations and any other legislative prescripts. The citation above is non-exhaustive and assistance may be required in other aspects.

6.1.2. Litigation relating to the areas identified above and any other including any other courts of law, statutory tribunals and other bodies

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- 6.1.3. Provide legal opinions, when requested on complex matters including but not limited to complex contracts, high impact of legislation etc.
- 6.1.4. Recovery of litigation costs or any other quantifiable matter.
- 6.1.5. Defending or instituting civil actions instituted by or against the merSETA in any court of law.
- 6.1.6. Defending the merSETA against criminal sanctions if applicable.

7. OUTCOMES AND DELIVERABLES

- 7.1. Provide the merSETA with a legal opinion on certain matters as and when required.
- 7.2. Review specific contracts and provide comments thereto as and when requested and deemed required; and
- 7.3. Provide the merSETA with specific legal advisory services in respect of certain matters as and when required.
- 7.4. Provide the merSETA with ad hoc legal support as and when required.

8. CONTENT OF SUBMISSIONS – VERY IMPORTANT

- 8.1. Provide a comprehensive proposal as per the scope of work above;
- 8.2. Three (3) written, signed and verifiable letters of reference where work of a similar nature was undertaken that is not older than six (6) months;
- 8.4. Any additional service offering relevant to the scope of work, as evidenced in the Company profile and the detailed scope of work;
- 8.5. Proof of registration on the Central Supplier Database hosted by National Treasury;
- 8.6. Certified copy of valid BBBEE certificate or affidavit
- 8.7. BBBEE Certificate issued by CIPC will be verified with CIPC (Companies and Intellectual Property Commission).
- 8.8. Fully completed and signed Vendor application form, SBD 1, 4, 6.1, 7.2, 8 and 9 forms.
- 8.9. Certified ID copies of all directors of the company;
- 8.10. Bidders to indicate if there will be any subcontracting and also indicate the percentage (%) on the SBD 6.1.
- 8.11. In instances of a joint venture /consortium the Joint Venture Certificate must be included. However for a subcontractor the B-BBEE certificate of both the contractor and subcontractor must be submitted.

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9. REQUIREMENTS

9.1. Bidder must have a minimum of three (3) years' experience in the business, that is, the firm must be operating for a minimum of three (3) years.

9.2. Bidder must prove capacity to undertake a project of this nature in areas including but not limited to commercial, corporate, research and criminal as well be able to complete the project by the due date. Amongst other things the following must be provided:

- Curriculum Vitae of all Legal Professionals
- A detailed portfolio of scope of work undertaken

9.3. Bidder must have the necessary approvals and permits from relevant authorities that enable and facilitate the respondent's ability to represent the merSETA appropriately. The Service Provider must comply with the following:

- All Legal Professionals are registered with the Law Society of South Africa
- The institution/law firm is up to date with Attorneys Fidelity Fund by providing and up to date Attorneys Fidelity Fund certificate
- Bid attorneys should must have the right of appearance.

9.4. Bidder must provide three (3) written, signed and verifiable letters (not older than six (6) months) of reference from clients where work of a similar nature was undertaken and must be prepared to take the merSETA representative on a site visit to such customer premises. The merSETA reference letters shall not be accepted.

The merSETA shall not pay for any unproductive or duplicated time spent by the service provider on any assignment as a result of staff changes, inefficiencies or rework.

13. EVALUATION PROCESS

All bids duly lodged will be evaluated on functionality and price. The evaluation criteria and weighting for measuring functionality are shown below:

The overall minimum threshold for functionality will be 75% where all individual thresholds are adhered to.

The evaluation of submitted bids will be conducted as follows:

Firstly, the bids will be evaluated for functionality based on the evaluation criteria and the minimum threshold as shown in the table above. Any bid that fails to meet the overall minimum threshold or has not received the minimum score for any individual component thresholds will be disqualified.

Thereafter, only the qualifying bids will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 preference points system, where only 20 points will be allocated in line with the bidder's B-BBEE status level of contribution.

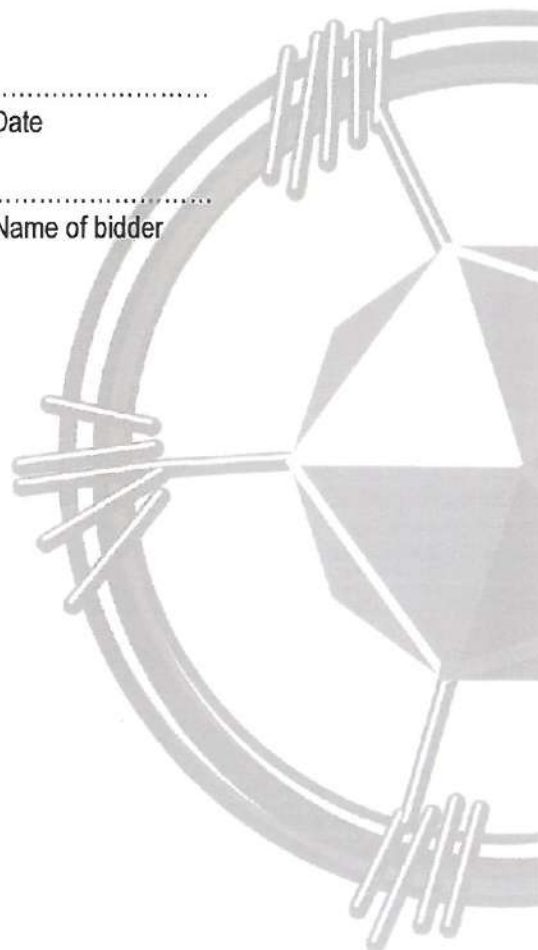
